4. Board of Studies
5. Such other authorities as may be designated by the University from time to time for the purpose of carrying out the functions of the University.

**1. Academic Council (AC)**

1.1 The Academic Council shall be the highest executive authority of the institution and shall be responsible for the implementation of the policies of the UGC. It shall be the authority primarily responsible for the overall management of the institution, including the management, approval of syllabus, curriculum, conduct of research and inquiry, examinations and tests, etc. The institution defined in the University shall exercise such powers and perform such functions as may be prescribed or authorised specifically in the Rules of the Institute.

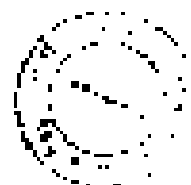
**1.2 Composition of the Academic Council:**

The Academic Council shall consist of the following members namely

1. Vice-Chancellor – 1 (Chairman)
2. Prof. V.K. Singh – 1 (Member)
3. Director of Education
4. Heads of the Departments
5. All Professors of the Institute (Head of the Department)
6. One representative Professor from the Departments of all the Departments by rotation of 2 years
7. One Assistant Professor from the Department of Education
8. Three Professors to be nominated by the Government of India or other authority or the institution of the Institute (one of the Professors to be nominated in the service of the Institute and one to be nominated by the Government of India or other authority)
9. One representative of the members of the staff as appointed by the Academic Council for the purpose of staff development
10. One representative of the staff of the Institute of the Academic Council

Note: The representatives of the Government of India shall be nominated by the Government of India and the representatives of the Institute shall be nominated by the Academic Council.

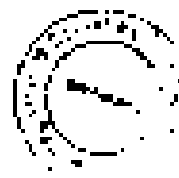

### 1.4 - Powers and Functions of the Academic Council:

#### i. Academic Council may have the following powers and functions:

- a. To consider and recommend to the Board of Management all the proposals of the Board of Management in those proposed by the departmental committees and its sub-committees.
- b. To exercise general supervision over the academic work of the institution directed by the deans and to give directions regarding methods of instruction, research and other improvements in academic standards.
- c. To prepare to each of the faculties and the university a regular report on the researches from time to time.
- d. To prepare courses of study leading to degrees and diplomas of the institution declared by the Council.
- e. To make arrangements for the conduct of examinations in accordance with the bye-laws.
- f. To appoint examiners, moderators, school-leavers and such other persons as may be required for the purpose.
- g. To maintain the standards of the examinations.
- h. To receive and determine and express of universities and other institutions and to determine the equivalence with the syllabus of the degrees of the institutions considered to be equivalent.
- i. To receive and determine the degree of the examinations.
- j. To make recommendations to the Board of Management.

- 2.5 The annual estimates of the Planning & Monitoring Board shall be prepared by the Board of Management for consideration and approval of the Board of Management. The Board of Management may also discuss the estimates with the Board of Management.

### **3.0 Finance Committee (FC)**

#### **3.1 Composition of the Finance Committee**

The Finance Committee shall consist of the following members:

1. Vice-Chancellor (Chairperson)
2. Deputy Vice-Chancellor
3. A representative nominated by the Secretary, Government
4. Two members of the Board of Management and two non-official senior members of the staff
5. #### **3.2 Terms of Office of the Finance Committee**

### 3.3 Powers and Functions of the Finance Committee:
